We have had lots of contributions from local businesses too. This week would like to show our appreciation to Phulnath Sweet Mart for their very generous donation.









Rainbow pasta salad

Ingredients and method

- 3. 28g carrots, diced
- 4. 28g broccoli, diced
- 5. 28g cheddar cheese diced
- 6. 28g black olives
- 7. 28g grape tomatoes
- 8. 28g red pepper, diced
- 9. 28g yellow pepper, diced
- 10. 28g red onion, diced
- 11. 28g dressing
- 12. And mix together!

Ultimately, taking your children out of school has a negative impact on their learning and is likely to prevent them from reaching their full potential. In some cases, this has also led to discussions with parents about our school values and that it is right for us to have high expectations on attendance.

We would also like to remind parents of booking appointment where possible out of school hours to reduce disruption to learning.


